

Silver Bullet Redux by Lee Earle

Imagine: Rip a ten-inch square from any newspaper. Write a prediction on your card and place it face down on the table.

Tear that square of newsprint in half, align the halves and tear again. Repeat until you have sixteen more-or-less square, equal size scraps.

Allow them randomly to flutter onto the table for a participant to gather in any order, then to eliminate all but one.

Your prediction exactly matches what is printed on that last remaining scrap.

Included are the original **Silver Bullet** three routines plus seven more, for a total of ten killer presentations. Use it to determine a pattern which exists only in your participant's imagination. No pumping, counting or forcing. Perform a design duplication using only borrowed business cards.

Put it to work in an impromptu book test with any paperback. No impressions, no anagrams, no duplicate books, no indexes. This is a brand new method in a book test!

Employ it on a serial number divination. It's not a shim, a glim, a switch, or a crib. Yet it's so easy, it almost works itself. You'll even be tempted to use it blindfolded!
